Looking back and looking forward

We are at a point where we remember the old year and look forward to the new. One helpful lesson we learn in life is that we need to have good closure for our endings in order to have a good start in our new beginnings. We have the present and future only because we have the past so remembering yesterday is a requirement for a better tomorrow. We need to look back on what we did so that we can look forward to the coming year and do a better job in 2007.

As one body of Christ, we, Moore's Chapel, experienced many things in the year 2006. Moore's Chapel has a very full and well rounded church life as we seek to serve Jesus Christ in every possible way: through Worship, Christian education for all ages, Bible studies, and in Mission to help others. Finally, we have faith in the future that God is going to do great things at Moore's Chapel and so we have embarked upon an ambitious building project.

In terms of worship, our strength is that we can provide two different styles of services. We are glad that we can provide a contemporary and a traditional service every Sunday so people can choose and praise God in their own way. Sunday worship attendance is steady. Moore's Chapel has various types of worship through dance, video clips, and art. Worship continues to be lively and fresh; People come each Sunday with expectations of reviving fellowship and inspirational worship. Our praise band, senior choir, and the contributions of many,

many lay people add so much to our worship services. The liturgy of Moore's Chapel is truly the "work of the people."

Our youth group steadily grew in the year 2006. Through GAS Station, Bible studies, Quest, and other various programs and activities, the youth improved in quality and quantity. Under the leadership of Jen Arter, the youth experienced many activities and programs, all to nurture the growth of our youth's spiritual lives, as well as have fun. The youth group has the full support of the congregation as they build a bright future for Moore's Chapel. The youth planned and delivered a service (Youth Sunday) by themselves, showing great capability and their love for God.

Vacation Bible School was held from July 30-Aug 4th 2006. This year's theme was "Trading Places." There were classes for ages 2- 14 and an average of 35 students and 20 volunteers were present each night. We ended the week with a closing program where the children presented what they had learned. The program was followed by a carnival. Eighty people attended the carnival; those that came had a great time together. on spiritual transformation in our daily lives. The feedback (from about 23 people who are participating) has been positive, and we will continue to work at understanding the word of God and applying His Word into our daily lives.

Once again, we did a great job under the guidance of the Evangelism/Mission Committee. Through the experience of door-to-door missions, we evangelized and introduced our church to our community. There were many mission moments during the church services that introduced us to new opportunities in serving. From April 3rd to the 8th 2006, nine people from the Moore's Chapel's family went down for another missions trip to Mississippi. The mission trips for Hurricane Katrina victims are not a one-time thing; the relationship will be continuous. I believe it is a good example of doing missions with consistency and integrity.

In the year 2006, several good friends have gone to be with the Lord: Maurine Ham, Flo Dixon, Rosalie Young, and Roger Mendenhall. While we celebrate their journey to heaven, the deaths of many of our friends have deprived us of the opportunity to do something more for them, so it is with grateful hearts we turn to God and to one another to find comfort and hope even in the midst of our loss. Throughout this experience, we bonded together spiritually. We reconfirmed that we are one family under God's love and grace.

Just as life and death are a part of the circle of life, Moore's Chapel has lost loved ones, but also gained new life. Along with the sorrow of loss comes the brightness of future Christians that now shine in our church. This spring, eleven youth celebrated completing confirmation class and testified to their newfound devotion to God. There were also marriages that marked a fresh beginning surrounded by God's love for the newlyweds – Montanna and Dan, and Yvonne and Mark. Many new college students – Michael, Megan, Courtney, Mallory, Matthew, and Mikey – from Moore's Chapel are soon-to-be teachers, artists, pastors, musicians, pharmacists, photographers, and much more, who will grow and share God's love and grace to the world.

2006 has been a year of much activity for the Moore's Chapel building committee. In February, we had a building pledge night complete with a meal and speaker that was open to the entire congregation. The results of these events were fantastic as almost \$ 300,000 was pledged over a three-year period. On December 9th, members of the building committee made a presentation to a group of conference officials outlining our plans and visions for the building project. The officials quickly approved our plans. The schedule for 2007 is as follows:

Please continue to pray for this project, continue to volunteer your time and talents, and most of all, let's continue to have faith in our Lord, Jesus Christ, whom through all things are possible!

As a pastor, I am very happy to serve God with you, and look forward to doing an even better job for the Kingdom of God in the year 2007.

The Secret of the Snowflakes

Scripture: Isaiah 1:18



What is snow? It is very common in winter. We roll in it, play in it, form balls with it, build forts of it, and, in general we have a rollicking good time in it. But what is it?

Snow is a form of water. In fact, it is a water crystal. The snowdrop is formed by a few drops of water freezing together. When several of the snowdrops cling together, they fall to the earth in a larger, fluffier form which we call a snowflake.

Snow is strangely beautiful and interesting. Have you ever examined a snow crystal closely? Probably not. Usually they disappear so quickly that you cannot catch even a fleeting impression of the shape of snowflakes.

You may be able to see that the flakes are six-sided crystals. And this is part of the secret of the snowflakes – they are all except for a small percentage of cone-shaped crystals, hexagons or six-sided figures. But this is not all; there is even more to the strange mystery. Although the snowflakes are either cones or hexagons, in all the many thousands that have been observed, photographed, and enlarged, NO TWO EXACTLY ALIKE HAVE EVER BEEN FOUND.

Snow is "warm". Few of us think of it in that way. But it is, for nine-tenths of snow is air. And it is for that reason that snow forms such a perfect warm blanket-like covering over the earth in winter's coldest weather, protecting the young roots and plants from freezing. Air is one of the best insulators we have. And since snow is nine-tenths air, we can believe that snow is "God's gift to plant life" in winter.

While we do not think of snow as warm, we do think about it as being very white and clean. When God wanted to tell us about something being pure and clean He had to compare it with something we would understand. God used snow as a comparison in the Old Testament and in the New Testament. From the Book of Isaiah we find, "Come now, and let us reason together, saith the Lord: Though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; ..."

God is trying to tell us what we need and what He will be for us. What we need to do is to talk to God about our sins, and if we really want Him to cleanse us He will make our hearts as white as snow.
