## Homecoming


Sunday, October 30<sup>th</sup>, at 10:30





## Missions and Evangelism

The Missions and Evangelism Committee is tasked with reaching out to people with the Good News of Jesus Christ, welcoming them with genuine Christian hospitality so that they may develop a relationship with God and live as Christian disciples. To accomplish this role, we have been busy these past few months...



We organized or participated in:

Cabin Fever: We had 34 groups attend. They handed out information about their activities and brought a craft for the kids. Moore's Chapel had a booth and over 50 kids make Resurrection Necklaces.

ServeFest: This community event was held on May 14<sup>th</sup>. Our church completed a large roofing project as well as projects at Plumpton Park Zoo and Fair Hill.

SunFest in Rising Sun: We had 125 kids come to the Moore's Chapel booth to make panda puppets to advertise for VBS.

In addition to the events, The Missions and Evangelism committee has been putting together welcome bags for our visitors. The bags will contain a pen, bookmark, and folder personalized with Moore's Chapel information. The folder will contain a Welcome Letter from Pastor Koo, Sunday School, and Youth Group. These bags should be available soon to help our visitors feel welcome and learn more about our ministry.

A Knight at The Castle: Moore's Chapel's family dance, returns from 6 – 8 pm. Admission is \$5 per person, kids 3 and under are free. 
